



# Winter Before and After Classes

January 7- March 15, 2019

## Monday

Jan 7th - March 11 (no classes Jan. 21 and Feb 18)

### **\*Primary Soccer (with Mr. Jackson) (ages 4-6)**

**3:00-4:15 p.m.** \$280 for 8 sessions

Join Mr. Jackson for a soccer adventure! Players will be introduced to the fundamentals of soccer, with an emphasis on individual skill-building and team play. Soccer is a great way for children to develop their gross-motor skills as it encourages them to use all parts of the body except the hands. They will learn how to open and close spaces, pass, shoot, keep goal, and control the ball.

### **Elementary AFTERNOON Chess (ages 6-12)**

**3:15-4:30 p.m.** \$360 for 8 sessions

Players work on developing opening strategies, middle game planning, and end-game theory, as well as tournament skills. Children will be placed together in the appropriate pairings according to their skill level. All the teachers have a hands-on teaching style to promote enthusiasm for chess along with critical thinking skills and sportsmanship. There will also be a 15-minute "Move of the Week" segment where students are introduced to a new move and then are challenged to use it their games.

### **Knitting (with Jeanne Moro) (LE & UE students)**

Students will begin by learning about yarn, needles, and gauge. They will be able to create fabric from yarn as they learn to cast on, knit and purl, bind off, and weave in ends. Projects may include a wristband or bracelet, "knitted candy," a small pillow, and a drawstring bag. This class is suitable for both beginners and more advanced knitters.

Drawing as a way to express feelings, tell stories, explain concepts, share ideas and develop imagination by drawing alone, in pairs, or in a group. Drawing what we see and don't see. Drawing ourselves, others, animals and plants, architectures and landscapes. Drawing with fingers, pencils, charcoal, ink, strings, erasers and tapes. Drawing blindfolded, to the beat of a metronome, standing up or laying down, with our two hands or with our feet. All we will do is drawing! Trips to Riverside Park and to the Metropolitan Museum of Art will be organized to draw inspiration from nature and original works of art.

## **Leaps and Tumbles (with Curated Care teacher) (ages 5-7)**

**3:00-4:15 p.m.** \$450 for 10 sessions

Class is designed to provide an introduction to body control and movement. This class inspires beginners and fine tunes more advanced tumblers and gymnasts. **8:00- 9:00 a.m. \*MORNING CLASS\*** \$350 for 10 sessions

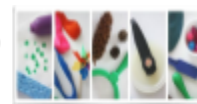

Each child will build and take home his/her own mechanical and electrical creations as well as learn about the inner workings of many of the toys and tools we come in contact with every day. Some projects are complex and take several weeks to complete.
